

A. HOW WILL THE SCHEME ALLOCATE ITS ASSETS?

The Margin may be placed in the form of such securities / instruments / deposits as may be permitted/eligible to be placed as margin from the assets of the Scheme. 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The Scheme may take an exposure to equity derivatives of constituents of the underlying Basket when securities of the Basket are unavailable, insufficient or for rebalancing at the time of change in Basket or in case of corporate actions, for a short period of time, subject to the limit of 20% of its net assets. Such exposure to derivatives will be rebalanced within seven calendar days or the next date of expiry of derivative contracts, whichever is later. The Scheme may use derivative instruments such as stock futures and options contracts, swap agreements or any other derivative instruments that are permissible or may be permissible in future under applicable regulations and such investments shall be in accordance with the investment objective of the Scheme and shall be subject to limit of 20% of the net assets of the Scheme.

Being a passively managed exchange traded fund, change in investment pattern is normally not foreseen. However, for short durations part of the corpus may be pending for deployment in Equities considering the market conditions, special events, corporate events (like declaration of dividend), etc.

Any transactions undertaken in the portfolio of the Scheme in order to meet the redemption and subscription obligations shall be done while ensuring that post such transactions replication of the portfolio with the index is maintained at all points of time.

iNAV of an ETF i.e. the per unit NAV based on the current market value of its portfolio during the trading hours of the ETF, shall be disclosed on a continuous basis on the Stock Exchange(s), where the units of these ETFs are listed and traded and shall be updated within a maximum time lag of 15 seconds from the market.

Rebalancing of deviation due to short term defensive consideration:

Any alteration in the investment pattern will be for a short term on defensive considerations as per paragraph 1.14.1.2.b of SEBI Master Circular; the intention being at all times to protect the interests of the Unit Holders and the Scheme shall rebalance the portfolio within 7 calendar days.lt may be noted that no prior intimation/indication will be given to investors when the composition/asset allocation pattern under the Scheme undergoes changes within the permitted band as indicated above.

Rebalancing in case of passive breaches:

In line with Paragraph 3.6.7 of the Master Circular in case of change in constituents of the index due to periodic review, the portfolio of Scheme shall be rebalanced within 7 calendar days. Further, any transactions undertaken in the portfolio of Index Schemes in order to meet the redemption and subscription obligations shall be done ensuring that post such transactions replication of the portfolio with the index is maintained at all points of time.

However, at all times the portfolio will adhere to the overall investment objectives of the Scheme. However, the same will be rectified at the earliest opportunity as may be available, but not later than 7 calendar days, to minimize the tracking error.

In the event of involuntary corporate action, the scheme shall dispose the security not forming part of the underlying index within 7 calendar days from the date of allotment/listing. Provided further and subject to the above, any change in the asset allocation affecting the investment profile of the Scheme shall be effected only in accordance with the provisions of sub regulation (15A) of Regulation 18 read with sub-regulation (26) of Regulation 25 of the SEBI Regulations.

Cash or cash equivalents with residual maturity of less than 91 days may be treated as not creating any exposure. AMFI vide letter dated November 3, 2021 has clarified that Cash Equivalent shall consist of Government Securities, T-Bills and Repo on Government Securities

B. WHERE WILL THE SCHEME INVEST?

The Scheme invests in the securities included in the Underlying Index regardless of their investment merit.

Subject to the Regulations and the disclosures as made under the Section "How the Scheme will allocate its Assets", the corpus of the Scheme can be invested in any (but not exclusive) of the following securities/ instruments:

- 1) Equity and equity related securities forming part of underlying index, including warrants carrying the right to obtain equity shares.
- 2) Derivative instruments like, Stock / Index Futures, Stock / Index Options and such other derivative instruments permitted by SEBI.
- 3) Units of debt schemes/ETFs, subject to applicable regulations.
- 4) TREPs[#], Repo and Reverse Repo, Cash & Cash equivalents.

*Or similar instruments as may be permitted by SEBI/RBI from time to time.

The Scheme may invest in other schemes managed by the AMC or in the schemes of any other Mutual Funds, provided it is in conformity with the investment objective of the Scheme and in terms of the prevailing Regulations. As per the Regulations, no investment management fees will be charged for such investments and the aggregate inter-scheme investment made by all Schemes of the Fund or in Schemes under the management of other asset management companies shall not exceed 5% of the Net Asset Value of the Mutual Fund.

The inter Scheme transfer of investments shall be in accordance with the provisions contained in paragraph 12.30 of the Master Circular pertaining to Inter-Scheme transfer of investments.

C. WHAT ARE THE INVESTMENT STRATEGIES?

The corpus of the Scheme will be invested predominantly in stocks constituting the underlying index in the same proportion as in the Index and endeavor to track the benchmark index. A very small portion (0-5% of the Net Assets) of the fund may be kept liquid to meet the liquidity and expense requirements. The fund may also use various derivatives and hedging instruments from time to time, as would be available and permitted by SEBI, in an attempt to protect the value of the portfolio and enhance Unitholders' interest.

The performance of the Scheme may not be commensurate with the performance of the underlying index on any given day or over any given period. Such variations are commonly referred to as the tracking error. The Scheme intends to maintain a low tracking error by closely aligning the portfolio in line with the index. The stocks comprising the underlying index are periodically reviewed by Index Service Provider. A particular stock may be dropped or new securities may be included as a constituent of the index. In such an event, the Fund will endeavor to reallocate its portfolio but the available investment/ disinvestment opportunities may not permit precise mirroring of the underlying index immediately. Similarly, in the event of a constituent stock being demerged / merged / delisted from the exchange or due to a major corporate action in a constituent stock, the fund may have to reallocate the portfolio and seek to minimize the variation from the index. In such events, it may be more prudent for the fund to take exposure through derivatives of the index itself or its constituent stocks in order to minimize the long term tracking error. The portfolio shall be rebalanced within 7 calendar days (or any other timeline as may be prescribed by SEBI) to ensure adherence to the asset allocation norms of the Scheme.

Equities and equity related instruments:

The Scheme would invest in stocks comprising the underlying index and endeavor to track the benchmark index.

Fixed Income Securities:

The Scheme may also invest in units of debt schemes / ETFs, TREPs, Repo and Reverse Repo, cash & cash equivalents, in compliance with Regulations to meet liquidity requirements. The scheme may also invest in liquid schemes of ICICI Prudential Mutual Fund or other schemes which has objective to invest in debt and money market instruments. Money Market Instruments include commercial papers, commercial bills, treasury bills, and Government securities having an unexpired maturity up to one year, call or notice money, certificate of deposit, usance bills, TREPs and any other like instruments as specified by the Reserve Bank of India from time to time, subject to regulatory approvals.

Investment in Derivatives:

The Scheme may take an exposure to equity derivatives of constituents of the underlying Basket when securities of the Basket are unavailable, insufficient or for rebalancing at the time of change in Basket or in case of corporate actions, for a short period of time. The Scheme may use derivative instruments such as stock futures and options contracts, warrants, convertible securities, swap agreements or any other derivative instruments that are permissible or may be permissible in future under applicable regulations and such investments shall be in accordance with the investment objective of the Scheme.

Implementation of Policies

The Scheme, in general, will hold all of the securities that comprise the Underlying Index in the same proportion as the index. Expectation is that, over time, the tracking error of the Scheme relative to the performance of the Underlying Index will be relatively low.

The Investment Manager would monitor the tracking error of the Scheme on an ongoing basis and would seek to minimize tracking error to the maximum extent possible. There can be no assurance or guarantee that the Scheme will achieve any particular level of tracking error relative to performance of the Underlying Index.

Investment Process

The Scheme will track the Underlying Index and is a passively managed scheme. The investment Decisions will be determined as per the Underlying Index. In case of any change in the index due to corporate actions or change in the constituents of the Underlying Index (as communicated by the Index Service Provider), relevant investment decisions will be determined considering the composition of the Underlying Index.

The Investment decision of the Scheme will be carried out by the designated Fund Manager.

D. HOW WILL THE SCHEME BENCHMARK ITS PERFORMANCE?

The performance of the Scheme will be benchmarked against Nifty Midcap 150 TRI.

Nifty Midcap 150 represents the next 150 companies (companies ranked 101-250) based on full market capitalisation from Nifty 500. This index intends to measure the performance of mid market capitalisation companies.

E. WHO MANAGES THE SCHEME?

The investments under the Scheme will be managed jointly by Mr. Nishit Patel, Ms. Priya Sridhar and Mr. Ajaykumar Solanki. As on September 30, 2024. Mr. Nishit Patel has been managing the scheme for the tenure of 3 years 9 months i.e. since January, 2021. Ms. Priya Sridhar and Mr. Ajaykumar Solanki have been managing the Scheme for a tenure of 8 months since February 2024. Their qualifications and experience are as under:



Pursuant to paragraph 10.1.3 of the master circular, SEB I (Mutual Funds) Second Amendment Regulations, 2012 and Securities and Exchange Board of India (Mutual Funds) (Fourth Amendment) Regulations, 2018, following additional costs or expenses may be charged to the scheme, namely:

- (i) The AMC may charge Goods and Services tax on investment and advisory fees to the scheme of the Fund in addition to the maximum limit of total expenses ratio as prescribed in Regulation 52 of the Regulations, whereas Goods and Services tax on other than investment and advisory fees, if any, shall be borne by the scheme within the maximum limit as per regulation 52 of the Regulations.
- (ii) expenses not exceeding of 0.30 per cent of daily net assets, if the new inflows from retail investors from B30 cities or as may be specified by the Securities and Exchange Board of India, from time to time are at least –

- 30 per cent of the gross new inflows from retail investors from B30 cities into the scheme, or;
- 15 per cent of the average assets under management (year to date) of the scheme,

whichever is higher;

Provided that if inflows from retail investors from B30 cities are less than the higher of the above, such expenses on daily net assets of the scheme shall be charged on proportionate basis;

Provided further that expenses charged under this clause shall be utilised for distribution expenses incurred for bringing inflows from retail investors from B30 cities:

Provided further that amount incurred as expense on account of inflows from retail investors from B30 cities shall be credited back to the scheme in case the said inflows are redeemed within a period of one year from the date of investment.

For above purposes, 'B30 cities' shall be beyond Top 30 cities as at the end of the previous financial year as communicated by AMFI. Retail investors would mean individual investors from whom inflows into the Scheme amount upto Rs. 2,00,000/per transaction.

Note - SEBI vide its letter no. SEBI/HO/IMD-SEC-3/P/OW/2023/5823/1 dated February 24, 2023 and AMFI letter dated No. 35P/ MEM-COR/ 85-a/ 2022-23 dated March 02, 2023 has directed AMCs to keep B-30 incentive structure in abeyance with effect from March 01, 2023 till further notice.

At least 1 basis point on daily net assets shall be annually set apart for investor education and awareness initiatives. The same shall be within limits specified under Regulation 52 of the SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulation.

Brokerage and transaction cost incurred for the purpose of execution of trade shall be charged to the schemes as provided under Regulation 52 (6A) (a) upto 12 bps and 5 bps for cash market transactions and derivatives transactions respectively. Any payment towards brokerage and transaction costs, over and above the said 12 bps and 5 bps for cash market transactions and derivatives transactions respectively may be charged to the scheme within the maximum limit of Total Expense Ratio (TER) as prescribed under regulation 52.

Expenses shall be charged / borne in accordance with the Regulations prevailing from time to time.

D. LOAD STRUCTURE

Exit Load is an amount, which is paid by the investor to redeem the units from the scheme. This amount is used by the AMC to pay trail commissions to the distributor and to take care of other marketing and selling expenses. Load amounts are variable and are subject to change from time to time. For the current applicable structure, please refer to the website of the AMC (www.icicipruamc.com) or may call your distributor.

The Eligible Investors can redeem units directly with the Fund/the AMC in accordance with the "minimum application amount". Currently there is no exit load applicable for the said transactions.

However, during the process of creation/redemption there may be transaction costs and/or other incidental expenses (forming part of the Cash Component), which are liable to be borne by the eligible investors.

Investors can directly approach the AMC for redemption of units of the Scheme, for transaction upto INR 25 Cr. without any exit load, in case of the following scenarios:

- i. Traded price (closing price) of the ETF units is at discount of more than 1% to the day end NAV for 7 continuous trading days, or
- ii. No quotes for such ETFs are available on stock exchange(s) for 3 consecutive trading days, or
- iii. Total bid size on the exchange is less than half of creation unit size daily, averaged over a period of 7 consecutive trading days.

Under these circumstances, investors, as specified above and can redeem units of the Scheme directly with the Fund/the AMC without any exit load. The Fund/the AMC will track the aforesaid liquidity criteria and display it on its website viz., https://icicietf.com/if the same is triggered, no exit load would be applicable in such cases.

The investor is requested to check the prevailing load structure of the Scheme before investing. Any imposition or enhancement in the load shall be applicable on prospective investments only. Units issued on reinvestment of IDCW shall not be subject to entry and exit load.

Subject to the Regulations, the Trustee reserves the right to modify/alter the load structure on the Units subscribed/redeemed on any Business Day. At the time of

changing the load structure, the AMC / Mutual Fund may adopt the following procedure:

- i. The addendum detailing the changes will be attached to Scheme Information Documents and key information memorandum. The addendum will be circulated to all the distributors/brokers so that the same can be attached to all Scheme Information Documents and key information memoranda already in stock.
- ii. Arrangements will be made to display the addendum in the Scheme Information Document in the form of a notice in all the investor service centres and distributors/brokers office.
- iii. A public notice shall be provided on the website of the AMC in respect of such changes.

- II. Scheme specific risk factors

Risk associated with investing in companies forming part of Nifty Midcap 150 Index:

The index tracks performance of 150 stocks (ranked 101-250) from Nifty 500. The scheme being passively managed invests in stocks of the underlying index and will therefore be subject to the risks associated with concentration. Midcap stocks can be riskier and more volatile on a relative basis. Therefore, the risk levels of investing in mid cap stocks may be relatively more than investing in large cap stocks. Over time, this category has demonstrated different levels of volatility and investment returns. Historically, these companies have been more volatile in price than large cap stocks, especially over the short-term. The liquidity of stocks of underlying constituents can affect the rebalancing of portfolio.

Risks associated with investing in Equities

The value of the Scheme's investments, may be affected generally by factors affecting securities markets, such as trading volumes, settlement periods and transfer procedures, price and volume volatility in the capital markets, interest rates, currency exchange rates, changes in policies of the Governments, taxation laws or any other appropriate authority policies and other political and economic developments which may have an adverse bearing on individual securities, a specific sector or all sectors including equity and debt markets. Consequently, the NAV of the Units of the Scheme may fluctuate and can go up or down.

While securities that are listed on the stock exchange carry lower liquidity risk, the ability to sell these investments is limited by the overall trading volume on the stock exchanges. The liquidity of the Schemes' investments is inherently restricted by trading volumes in the securities in which it invests.

Trading volumes, settlement periods and transfer procedures may restrict the liquidity of these investments. Different segments of the Indian financial markets have different settlement periods and such periods may be extended significantly by unforeseen circumstances. The inability of the Schemes to make intended securities purchases due

to settlement problems could cause the Schemes to miss certain investment opportunities.

The schemes will also be vulnerable to movements in the prices of securities invested by the schemes which again could have a material bearing on the overall returns from the schemes.

Market Risk

The Scheme's NAV will react to the stock market movements. The Investors could lose money over short periods due to fluctuation in the Scheme's NAV in response to factors such as economic and political developments, changes in interest rates and perceived trends in stock prices and market movements, and over longer periods during market downturns.

Market Trading Risks

- Absence of Prior Active Market: Although units of the Scheme are to be listed on the Exchanges, there can be no assurance that an active secondary market will develop or be maintained.
- Lack of Market Liquidity: Trading in units of the respective Scheme on the Exchange may be halted because of market conditions or for reasons that in the view of the Market Authorities or SEBI, trading in units of the Scheme are not advisable. In addition, trading in units of the Scheme is subject to trading halts caused by extraordinary market volatility and pursuant to BSE/NSE and SEBI "circuit filter" rules. There can be no assurance that the requirements of the Market necessary to maintain the listing of units of the Scheme will continue to be met or will remain unchanged.
- Units of the Scheme may trade at Prices Other than NAV: Units of the Scheme may trade above or below its NAV. The NAV of the Scheme will fluctuate with changes in the market value of Scheme's holdings. The trading prices of units of the Scheme will fluctuate in accordance with changes in their NAVs as well as market supply and demand of units of the Scheme. However, given that units can be created and redeemed only in Creation Units directly with the Fund, it is expected that large discounts or premiums to the NAVs of the Scheme will not sustain due to arbitrage possibility available.
- Regulatory Risk: Any changes in trading regulations by the Stock Exchange/s or SEBI may affect the ability of market maker to arbitrage resulting into wider premium/ discount to NAV. Although, the units are listed on BSE and NSE, the AMC and the Trustees will not be liable for delay in listing of Units of the Scheme on the stock exchanges / or due to connectivity problems with the depositories and/or due to the occurrence of any event beyond their control.
- Settlement Risk: In certain cases, settlement periods may be extended significantly by unforeseen circumstances. The inability of the Scheme to make intended securities purchases due to settlement problems could cause the Scheme to miss certain investment opportunities as in certain cases, settlement periods may be extended significantly by unforeseen circumstances. Similarly, the inability

to sell securities held in the Scheme portfolio may result, at times, in potential losses to the Scheme, and there can be a subsequent decline in the value of the securities held in the Scheme's portfolio.

Right to Limit Redemptions: The Trustee, in the general interest of the Unit holders
of the Scheme offered in this Document and keeping in view the unforeseen
circumstances / unusual market conditions, may limit the total number of Units
which can be redeemed on any Business Day. The same shall be in accordance
with paragraph 1.12 of the master circular.

Volatility Risk

The equity markets and derivative markets are volatile and the value of securities, derivative contracts and other instruments correlated with the equity markets may fluctuate dramatically from day to day. This volatility may cause the value of investment in the Scheme to decrease.

Redemption Risk

Investors should note that even though the Scheme is an open ended Scheme, subscription/redemptions directly with the Fund would be subject to minimum application amount. However, investors wishing to subscribe/redeem units can do so by buying/selling the same on the Stock Exchange.

Passive Investments

The Scheme is a passively managed scheme and may be affected by a general decline in the Indian markets relating to its Underlying Index. The Scheme invests in the securities included in its Underlying Index regardless of their investment merit. The AMC does not attempt to individually select stocks or to take defensive positions in declining markets.

Tracking Error Risk

The AMC would monitor the tracking error of the Scheme on an ongoing basis and would seek to minimize tracking error to the maximum extent possible. However, this may vary due to various reasons mentioned below or any other reasons that may arise and particularly when the markets are very volatile.

Factors such as the fees and expenses of the Scheme, corporate actions, cash balance, changes to the Underlying Index and regulatory policies may affect the AMC's ability to achieve close correlation with the Underlying Index of the Scheme. The Scheme's returns may therefore deviate from those of their Underlying Index. "Tracking Error" is defined as the standard deviation of the difference between daily returns of the index and the NAV of the Scheme. Tracking Error may arise due to the following reasons: -

- Expenditure incurred by the Scheme.
- Any delay experienced in the purchase or sale of shares due to illiquidity of the market, settlement and realization of sale proceeds and the registration of any securities transferred and any delays in receiving cash and dividends and resulting delays in reinvesting them.

- Securities trading may halt temporarily due to circuit filters.
- The underlying index reflects the prices of securities at close of business hours.
 However, the Fund may buy or sell the securities at different points of time during
 the trading session at the then prevailing prices which may not correspond to the
 closing prices on the exchange.
- Index Service Provider undertakes the periodical review of the scrips that
 comprise the underlying index and may either drop or include new securities. In
 such an event, the Fund will endeavor to reallocate its portfolio but the available
 investment/ disinvestment opportunities may not permit precise mirroring of the
 Index immediately.
- The potential for trades to fail which may result in the Scheme not having acquired shares at a price necessary to track the index.
- The holding of cash position and accrued income prior to distribution and accrued expenses.
- The fund may not be invested at all times as it may keep a portion of the fund in cash to meet redemptions or for corporate actions of securities in the index.
- Corporate actions such as rights, merger, change in constituents etc.
- Rounding off quantity of shares underlying the index.
- Disinvestments to meet redemptions, recurring expenses, dividend payouts etc.

Risk associated with investing in Fixed Income securities:

The scheme may invest in units of debt schemes or debt ETFs of ICICI Prudential Mutual Fund or other schemes which may be subject to risks as stated below.

- Market Risk: The Net Asset Value (NAV) of the underlying scheme(s), to the extent invested in fixed income securities, will be affected by changes in the general level of interest rates. The NAV of the underlying scheme(s) is expected to increase from a fall in interest rates while it would be adversely affected by an increase in the level of interest rates. The movements in interest rate depend on various factors such as government borrowing, inflation, economic performance etc.
- **Liquidity Risk:** The liquidity of a security may change depending on market conditions leading to changes in the liquidity premium linked to the price of the security. At the time of selling the security, the security can become illiquid leading to loss in the value of the portfolio.
- **Credit Risk:** Investments in fixed income securities are subject to the risk of an issuer's inability to meet interest and principal payments on its obligations and market perception of the creditworthiness of the issuer.
- Price Risk: Government securities where a fixed return is offered run price-risk like any other fixed income security. Generally, when interest rates rise, prices of fixed income securities fall and when interest rates drop, the prices increase. The extent of fall or rise in the prices is a function of the existing coupon, days to maturity and the increase or decrease in the level of interest rates. The new level of interest rate is determined by the rates at which government raises new money and/or the price levels at which the market is already dealing in existing securities. The price-risk is not unique to Government Securities. It exists for all fixed income securities. However, Government Securities are unique in the sense that their credit risk

generally remains zero. Therefore, their prices are influenced only by movement in interest rates in the financial system.

- Reinvestment Risk: This risk refers to the interest rate levels at which cash flows
 received from the securities in the underlying scheme(s) are reinvested. The
 additional income from reinvestment is the "interest on interest" component. The
 risk is that the rate at which interim cash flows can be reinvested may be lower
 than that originally assumed.
- Settlement risk: The inability of the underlying scheme(s) to make intended securities purchases due to settlement problems could cause the underlying scheme(s) to miss certain investment opportunities. By the same rationale, the inability to sell securities held in the underlying scheme(s)' portfolio due to the extraneous factors that may impact liquidity would result, at times, in potential losses to the Plan, in case of a subsequent decline in the value of securities held in the underlying scheme(s)' portfolio.
- **Regulatory Risk:** Changes in government policy in general and changes in tax benefits applicable to Mutual Funds may impact the returns to investors in the underlying scheme(s).
- Risks associated with investment in unlisted securities: Except for any security of an associate or group company, the underlying scheme(s) can invest in securities which are not listed on a stock exchange ("unlisted Securities") which in general are subject to greater price fluctuations, less liquidity and greater risk than those which are traded in the open market. Unlisted securities may lack a liquid secondary market and there can be no assurance that the underlying scheme(s) will realise their investments in unlisted securities at a fair value.
- Different types of fixed income securities in which the underlying scheme(s) would invest as given in the Scheme Information Document carry different levels and types of risk. Accordingly, the underlying scheme(s) risk may increase or decrease depending upon its investment pattern. e.g. corporate bonds carry a higher level of risk than Government securities.
- The underlying scheme(s) may, considering the overall level of risk of the portfolio, invest in lower rated securities offering higher yields as well as zero coupon securities that offer attractive yields. This may increase the absolute level of risk of the underlying scheme(s).
- As zero coupon securities do not provide periodic interest payments to the holder
 of the security, these securities are more sensitive to changes in interest rates.
 Therefore, the interest rate risk of zero coupon securities is higher. The underlying
 scheme(s) may choose to invest in zero coupon securities that offer attractive
 yields. This may increase the risk of the portfolio.
- The underlying scheme(s) at times may receive large number of redemption requests, leading to an asset-liability mismatch and therefore, requiring the investment manager to make a distress sale of the securities leading to realignment of the portfolio and consequently resulting in investment in lower yield instruments.

• Scheme's performance may differ from the benchmark index to the extent of the investments held in the debt segment, as per the investment pattern indicated under normal circumstances.

Risks associated with Debt ETFs:

Value of securities

Underlying Debt securities in a Debt ETF may be subject to any economic and political developments, changes in interest rate risk, credit risk, liquidity risk etc. At the time of selling the security, the security can become illiquid leading to loss in the value of the portfolio. Also, the value of investments can appreciate/depreciate if the interest rates fall/rise

Lack of Vibrant Secondary Market for Units of the underlying scheme:

Although the Units of the underlying scheme will be listed on the Stock Exchanges such as NSE & BSE, there can be no assurance that a vibrant secondary market for units of the Scheme will be developed or maintained by the Authorised Participants.

Halting of Trading in Units of the underlying scheme:

Trading in the units of the schemes on NSE/BSE may be halted because of market conditions or for reasons that in view of NSE/BSE, SEBI or any other Regulatory authorities. In addition, trading of the Units of the underlying scheme are subject to trading halts caused by extraordinary market volatility and pursuant to stock exchange and SEBI 'circuit filter' rules.

There can be no assurance that the requirements of NSE/BSE necessary to maintain the listing of the units of the scheme will continue to be met or will remain unchanged.

Lack of secondary market depth:

In case of unit creation and unit redemption, the underlying scheme will have to either buy a basket of securities or sell a basket of securities in proportion of the underlying index. This requires an active secondary market for underlying securities at all points of time. A lack of depth in secondary market for underlying securities could hamper the efficient transaction in unit creation and unit redemption.

Risks associated with investing in Tri Party Repo through CCIL (TREPS):

- The mutual fund is a member of securities segment and Tri-party Repo trade settlement of the Clearing Corporation of India (CCIL). All transactions of the mutual fund in government securities and in Tri-party Repo trades are settled centrally through the infrastructure and settlement systems provided by CCIL; thus reducing the settlement and counterparty risks considerably for transactions in the said segments.
- CCIL maintains prefunded resources in all the clearing segments to cover
 potential losses arising from the default member. In the event of a clearing
 member failing to honour his settlement obligations, the default Fund is utilized
 to complete the settlement. The sequence in which the above resources are used
 is known as the "Default Waterfall".
- As per the waterfall mechanism, after the defaulter's margins and the defaulter's contribution to the default fund have been appropriated, CCIL's contribution is

- used to meet the losses. Post utilization of CCIL's contribution if there is a residual loss, it is appropriated from the default fund contributions of the non-defaulting members.
- Thus the scheme is subject to risk of the initial margin and default fund contribution being invoked in the event of failure of any settlement obligations. In addition, the fund contribution is allowed to be used to meet the residual loss in case of default by the other clearing member (the defaulting member).
- However, it may be noted that a member shall have the right to submit resignation from the membership of the Security segment if it has taken a loss through replenishment of its contribution to the default fund for the segments and a loss threshold as notified have been reached. The maximum contribution of a member towards replenishment of its contribution to the default fund in the 7 days (30 days in case of securities segment) period immediately after the afore-mentioned loss threshold having been reached shall not exceed 5 times of its contribution to the Default Fund based on the last re-computation of the Default Fund or specified amount, whichever is lower.
- Further, it may be noted that, CCIL periodically prescribes a list of securities
 eligible for contributions as collateral by members. Presently, all Central
 Government securities and Treasury bills are accepted as collateral by CCIL. The
 risk factors may undergo change in case the CCIL notifies securities other than
 Government of India securities as eligible for contribution as collateral.

Risk factors associated with creation of segregated portfolios

1. Liquidity risk – A segregated portfolio is created when a credit event occurs at an issuer level in the scheme. This may reduce the liquidity of the security issued by the said issuer, as demand for this security may reduce. This is also further accentuated by the lack of secondary market liquidity for corporate papers in India. As per SEBI norms, the scheme is to be closed for redemption and subscriptions until the segregated portfolio is created, running the risk of investors being unable to redeem their investments. However, it may be noted that, the proposed segregated portfolio is required to be formed within one day from the occurrence of the credit event.

Investors may note that no redemption and subscription shall be allowed in the segregated portfolio. However, in order to facilitate exit to unit holders in segregated portfolio, AMC shall list the units of the segregated portfolio on a recognized stock exchange within 10 business days of creation of segregated portfolio and also enable transfer of such units on receipt of transfer requests. For the units listed on the exchange, it is possible that the market price at which the units are traded may be at a discount to the NAV of such Units. There is no assurance that a deep secondary market will develop for units of segregated portfolio listed on the stock exchange. This could limit the ability of the investors to resell them.

3. Valuation risk - The valuation of the securities in the segregated portfolio is required to be carried out in line with the applicable SEBI guidelines. However, it may be difficult to ascertain the fair value of the securities due to absence of an active secondary market and difficulty to price in qualitative factors.

Risks associated with investing in ADR/ GDR/ Foreign securities:

The Scheme will not invest in ADR/GDR/Foreign securities.

Risks associated with investing in Derivatives:

- The Schemes may use various derivative products as permitted by the Regulations.
 Use of derivatives requires an understanding of not only the underlying instrument
 but also of the derivative itself. Other risks include the risk of mis-pricing or
 improper valuation and the inability of derivatives to correlate perfectly with
 underlying assets, rates and indices.
- The Scheme may use derivatives instruments like Stock Index Futures or other derivative instruments for the purpose of hedging and portfolio balancing, as permitted under the Regulations and guidelines. Usage of derivatives will expose the Schemes to certain risks inherent to such derivatives.
- Derivative products are leveraged instruments and can provide disproportionate
 gains as well as disproportionate losses to the investor. Execution of such
 strategies depends upon the ability of the fund manager to identify such
 opportunities. Identification and execution of the strategies to be pursued by the
 fund manager involve uncertainty and decision of fund manager may not always
 be profitable. No assurance can be given that the fund manager will be able to
 identify or execute such strategies.
- Thus, derivatives are highly leveraged instruments. Even a small price movement
 in the underlying security could have a large impact on their value. Also, the market
 for derivative instruments is nascent in India.
- The risks associated with the use of derivatives are different from or possibly greater than the risks associated with investing directly in securities and other traditional investments.
- The specific risk factors arising out of a derivative strategy used by the Fund Manager may be as below:
 - > The risk of mispricing or improper valuation and the inability of derivatives to correlate perfectly with underlying assets, rates and indices.
 - Execution Risk: The prices which are seen on the screen need not be the same at which execution will take place
 - Basis Risk: This risk arises when the derivative instrument used to hedge the underlying asset does not match the movement of the underlying asset being hedged
 - > Exchanges could raise the initial margin, variation margin or other forms of margin on derivative contracts, impose one sided margins or insist that margins be placed in cash. All of these might force positions to be unwound at a loss, and might materially impact returns.

The Scheme will not have any exposure to Debt Derivatives.

Risks associated with investing in securitzed debt:

The Scheme will not invest in securitized debt.

Risks associated with Short Selling

The Scheme will not engage in short selling of securities.

Risks associated with Securities Lending:

Securities lending is lending of securities through an approved intermediary to a borrower under an agreement for a specified period with the condition that the borrower will return equivalent securities of the same type or class at the end of the specified period along with the corporate benefits accruing on the securities borrowed.

The risks in security lending consist of the failure of intermediary / counterparty, to comply with the terms of agreement entered into between the lender of securities i.e. the Scheme and the intermediary / counterparty. Such failure to comply can result in the possible loss of rights in the collateral put up by the borrower of the securities, the inability of the approved intermediary to return the securities deposited by the lender and the possible loss of any corporate benefits accruing to the lender from the securities deposited with the approved intermediary. The scheme may not be able to sell lent out securities, which can lead to temporary illiquidity & loss of opportunity.

Investors are requested to refer to section "**How will the Scheme allocate its assets?**" for maximum permissible exposure to Securities Lending.

Apart from the risk factors mentioned above, the scheme is exposed to certain specific risks, which are as mentioned below –

- (i) Performance of the underlying Index will have a direct bearing on the performance of the Scheme. In the event when the index is dissolved or is withdrawn, the Trustee reserves a right to modify the Scheme so as to track a different and suitable index and appropriate intimation will be sent to the unitholders of the Scheme.
- (ii) Tracking errors are inherent in any ETF and such errors may cause the Scheme to generate returns which are not in line with the performance of the Index or one or more securities covered by / included in the Index.
- (iii) In case of investments in derivative instruments, the risk/ reward would be the same as investments in portfolio of shares representing an index. However, there may be a cost attached to buying an index future. Further, there could be an element of settlement risk, which could be different from the risk in settling physical shares and there is a risk attached to the liquidity and the depth of the index futures market as it is relatively new market for Index and also it is relatively less popular as compared to the Index.
- (iv) In the event of index mentioned above, is dissolved or is withdrawn by NSE Indices Limited (NSE Indices) or is not published due to any reason whatsoever, the Trustee reserves the right to modify the Scheme so as track a different and suitable index or to suspend tracking the Nifty till such time it is dissolved/ withdrawn or not published and appropriate intimation will be sent to the Unitholders of the Scheme. In such a case, the investment pattern will be modified suitably to match the composition of the securities that are included in the new index to be tracked and the Scheme will be subject to tracking errors during the intervening period.

c.Risk Mitigation Strategies

The Scheme by utilizing a holistic risk management strategy will endeavor to manage risks associated with investing in equity markets. The risk control process involves identifying & measuring the risk through various risk measurement tools.

The Scheme has identified following risks of investing in equity and designed risk management strategies, which are embedded in the investment process to manage such risks.

Exposure with respect to derivatives shall be in line with regulatory limits and the limits specified in the SID.

Risks associated with Debt investment

Market Risk/ Interest Rate Risk

As with all debt securities, changes in interest rates may affect the underlying scheme(s)' Net Asset Value as the prices of securities generally increase as interest rates decline and generally decrease as interest rates rise. Prices of long-term securities generally fluctuate more in response to interest rate changes than do short-term securities. Indian debt markets can be volatile leading to the possibility of price movements up or down in fixed income securities and thereby to possible movements in the NAV.

The underlying scheme(s) may undertake active portfolio management as per the investment objective to reduce the market risk. In a rising interest rates scenario the underlying scheme(s) may increase its investment in money market securities whereas if the interest rates are expected to fall the allocation to debt securities with longer maturity may be increased thereby mitigating risk to that extent.

Liquidity or Marketability Risk

This refers to the ease with which a security can be sold at or near to its valuation yield-to-maturity (YTM).

The underlying scheme(s) may invest in government securities, corporate bonds and money market instruments. While the liquidity risk for government securities, money market instruments and short maturity corporate bonds may be low, it may be high in case of medium to long maturity corporate bonds.

The underlying scheme(s) may however, endeavor to minimize liquidity risk by investing in securities having a relatively liquid market.

Credit Risk

Credit risk or default risk refers to the risk that an issuer of a fixed income security may default (i.e., will be unable to make timely principal and interest payments on the security). Management analysis may be used for identifying company specific risks. Management's past track record may also be studied. In order to assess financial risk an assessment of the issuer's financial statements may be undertaken.

Reinvestment Risk

This risk refers to the interest rate levels at which cash flows received from the securities in the Schemes are reinvested. The risk is that the rate at which interim cash flows can be reinvested may be lower than that originally assumed.

Reinvestment risks will be limited to the extent of coupons received on debt instruments, which will be a very small portion of the portfolio value.

Risks associated with Debt/Money market investments

A detailed evaluation of accounting policies, off-balance sheet exposures, notes, auditors' comments and disclosure standards will also be made to assess the overall financial risk of the potential borrower.

Reinvestment Risk

This risk refers to the interest rate levels at which cash flows received from the securities in the Schemes are reinvested. The risk is that the rate at which interim cash flows can be reinvested may be lower than that originally assumed.

Reinvestment risks will be limited to the extent of coupons received on debt instruments, which will be a very small portion of the portfolio value.

Note: The information contained herein is based on current market conditions and may change from time to time based on changes in such conditions, regulatory changes and other relevant factors. Accordingly, our investment strategy, risk mitigation measures and other information contained herein may change in response to the same.

II. Information about the scheme

A. Where will the scheme invest?

Subject to the Regulations and the disclosures as made under the Section "How the Scheme will allocate its Assets", the corpus of the Scheme can be invested in any (but not exclusive) of the following securities/ instruments:

- 1) Equity and equity related securities forming part of underlying index, including warrants carrying the right to obtain equity shares.
- 2) Derivative instruments like, Stock / Index Futures, Stock / Index Options and such other derivative instruments permitted by SEBI.
- 3) Units of debt schemes/ETFs, subject to applicable regulations.
- 4) TREPs#, Repo and Reverse Repo, Cash & Cash equivalents.

*Or similar instruments as may be permitted by SEBI/RBI from time to time.

The Scheme may invest in other schemes managed by the AMC or in the schemes of any other Mutual Funds, provided it is in conformity with the investment objective of the Scheme and in terms of the prevailing Regulations. As per the Regulations, no investment management fees will be charged for such investments and the aggregate inter-scheme investment made by all Schemes of the Fund or in Schemes under the management of other asset management companies shall not exceed 5% of the Net Asset Value of the Mutual Fund.

The inter Scheme transfer of investments shall be in accordance with the provisions contained in paragraph 12.30 of the Master Circular pertaining to Inter-Scheme transfer of investments

POSITION OF DEBT MARKET IN INDIA

There are three main segments in the debt markets in India, viz., Government Securities, Public Sector Units (PSU) bonds, and corporate securities. A bulk of the debt market consists of Government Securities. Other instruments available currently include Corporate Debentures, Bonds issued by Financial Institutions, Commercial Paper, Certificates of Deposits and Securitized Debt. Securities in the Debt market typically vary based on their tenure and rating. Government Securities have tenures from one year to thirty years whereas the maturity period of the Corporate Debt now goes upto sixty years and more (perpetual). Perpetual bonds are now issued by banks as well. Securities may be both listed and unlisted and there is increasing trend of securities of maturities of over one year being listed by issuers.

B. What are the investment restrictions?

Pursuant to the Regulations and amendments thereto and subject to the investment pattern of the Scheme, following investment restrictions are presently applicable to the Scheme:

1) The Fund under all its schemes shall not own more than 10% of any company's paid up capital carrying voting rights.

Provided, investment in the asset management company or the trustee company of a mutual fund shall be governed by clause (a), of sub-regulation (1), of regulation 7B

2) A mutual fund scheme shall not invest more than 10% of its NAV in debt instruments comprising money market instruments and non-money market instruments issued by a single issuer which are rated not below investment grade by a credit rating agency authorised to carry out such activity under the Act as per the following matrix.

A mutual fund scheme shall not invest more than:

- a. 10% of its NAV in debt and money market securities rated AAA; or
- b. 8% of its NAV in debt and money market securities rated AA; or
- c. 6% of its NAV in debt and money market securities rated A and below issued by a single issuer.

The above investment limits may be extended by up to 2% of the NAV of the scheme with prior approval of the Board of Trustees and Board of Directors of the AMC, subject to compliance with the overall 12% limit specified in clause 1 of Seventh Schedule of MF Regulation.

- b) Provided that such limit shall not be applicable for investments in Government Securities, treasury bills and TREPs:
- c) Provided further that investment within such limit can be made in mortgaged backed securitised debt which are rated not below investment grade by a credit rating agency registered with the Board.

A mutual fund scheme shall not invest in unlisted debt instruments including commercial papers, except Government Securities and other money market instruments.

- 3) No sponsor of a mutual fund, its associate or group company including the asset management company of the fund, through the schemes of the mutual fund or otherwise, individually or collectively, directly or indirectly, have -
 - 10% or more of the share-holding or voting rights in the asset management company or the trustee company of any other mutual fund; or
 - ii. representation on the board of the asset management company or the trustee company of any other mutual fund.
- 4) Transfer of investments from one scheme to another scheme in the same Mutual Fund is permitted provided:
 - 1. Such transfers are done at the prevailing market price for quoted instruments on spot basis (spot basis shall have the same meaning as specified by a Stock Exchange for spot transactions); and
 - 2. The securities so transferred shall be in conformity with the investment objective of the scheme to which such transfer has been made.

Further the inter scheme transfer of investments shall be in accordance with the provisions contained in clause Inter-Scheme transfer of investments, contained in Statement of Additional Information. The AMC shall comply with the guidelines stated in paragraph 12.30 of the master circular.

- 5) The Fund shall get the securities purchased transferred in the name of the Fund on account of the concerned scheme, wherever investments are intended to be of a long-term nature.
- 6) No mutual fund Scheme shall make any investments in;
 - a) any unlisted security of an associate or group company of the sponsor; or
 - b) any security issued by way of private placement by an associate or group company of the Sponsor; or
 - c) the listed securities of group companies of the Sponsor which is in excess of 25% of its net assets (except for investments by equity oriented exchange traded funds and index funds and subject to such conditions as maybe specified by the Board).
- 7) The Fund shall buy and sell securities on the basis of deliveries and shall in all cases of purchases, take delivery of relative securities and in all cases of sale, deliver the securities and will not make any short sales or engage in carry forward transaction or badla finance. Provided that mutual funds shall enter into derivatives transactions in a recognised stock exchange for the purpose of hedging and portfolio balancing, in accordance with the Regulations.
- 8) No loans for any purpose can be advanced by the Scheme.
- 9) The Fund shall not borrow except to meet temporary liquidity needs of the Fund for the purpose of repurchase/ redemption of units or payment of interest and IDCW to the Unitholders. Such borrowings shall not exceed more than 20% of

the net assets of the individual scheme and the duration of the borrowing shall not exceed a period of 6 months.

- 10) The Fund having an aggregate of securities which are worth Rs.10 crores or more, as on the latest balance sheet date, shall subject to such instructions as may be issued from time to time by the Board, settle their transactions entered on or after January 15, 1998 only through dematerialised securities. Further, all transactions in government securities shall be in dematerialised form.
- 11) The Scheme will comply with any other Regulation applicable to the investments of mutual funds from time to time.
- 12) The Scheme may invest in other Schemes under the same AMC or any other Mutual Fund without charging any fees, provided the aggregate inter-Scheme investment made by all the Schemes under the same management or in Schemes under management of any other asset management company shall not exceed 5% of the Net Asset Value of the Fund. No investment management fees shall be charged for investing in other Schemes of the Fund or in the Schemes of any other mutual fund.
- 12) In accordance with paragraph 12.16 of the master circular, following guidelines shall be followed for parking of fund in short term deposits of Scheduled commercial Banks pending deployment, for a maximum period of 7 business days.
- a. "Short Term" for such parking of fund by mutual fund shall be treated as a period not exceeding 91 days.
- b. Such short term deposits shall be held in the name of the concerned scheme.
- c. No mutual fund scheme shall park more than 15% of the net assets in Short term deposit(s) of all the scheduled commercial Banks put together. However, it may be raised to 20% with prior approval of the trustees. Also, parking of fund in short term deposits of associate and sponsor scheduled commercial Banks together shall not exceed 20% of total deployment by the mutual fund in short term deposits.
- d. No mutual fund scheme shall park more than 10% of the net assets in short term deposit(s), with any one scheduled commercial Bank including its subsidiaries.
- e. Trustees/Asset Management Companies (AMCs) shall ensure that no funds of a scheme are parked in short term deposit (STD) of a bank which has invested in that scheme. Trustees/AMCs shall also ensure that the bank in which a scheme has STD do not invest in the said scheme until the scheme has STD with such bank.

Above conditions are not applicable to term deposits placed as margins for trading in cash and derivative market.

- f. Asset Management Company (AMC) shall not be permitted to charge any investment management and advisory fees for parking of fund in short term deposits of scheduled commercial Banks in case of liquid and debt oriented schemes.
- g. All fund parked in short term deposit(s) shall be disclosed in half yearly portfolio statements under a separate heading. Details such as name of the Bank, amount of fund parked, percentage of NAV may be disclosed.
- h. Trustees shall certify in the half-yearly reports that the provision of the Regulation pertaining to parking of fund in short term deposits pending deployment is being complied with at all points of time. Further the AMC shall also certify the same in its bi-monthly compliance test report.
- 13) The Scheme will comply with the provisions specified in Circular dated August 18, 2010 related to overall exposure limits applicable for derivative transactions as stated below:
 - i. The cumulative gross exposure across all asset classes should not exceed 100% of the net assets of the scheme.
 - ii. Mutual Funds shall not write options or purchase instruments with embedded written options.
- iii. The total exposure related to option premium paid must not exceed 20% of the net assets of the scheme.
- iv. Cash or cash equivalents with residual maturity of less than 91 days may be treated as not creating any exposure.
- v. Exposure due to hedging positions may not be included in the above mentioned limits subject to the following:
 - a. Hedging positions are the derivative positions that reduce possible losses on an existing position in securities and till the existing position remains.
 - b. Hedging positions cannot be taken for existing derivative positions. Exposure due to such positions shall have to be added and treated under limits mentioned in Point 1.
 - c. Any derivative instrument used to hedge has the same underlying security as the existing position being hedged.
 - d. The quantity of underlying associated with the derivative position taken for hedging purposes does not exceed the quantity of the existing position against which hedge has been taken.
- vi. (a) Mutual Funds may enter into plain vanilla Interest Rate Swaps (IRS) for hedging purposes. The value of the notional principal in such cases must not exceed the value of respective existing assets being hedged by the scheme.
 - (b) In case of participation in IRS is through over the counter transactions, the counter party has to be an entity recognized as a market maker by RBI and exposure to a single counterparty in such transactions should not exceed 10% of the net assets of the scheme. However, if mutual funds are transacting in IRS through an electronic trading platform offered by the

Clearing Corporation of India Ltd. (CCIL) and CCIL is the central counterparty for such transactions guaranteeing settlement, the single counterparty limit of 10% shall not be applicable.

- vii. Exposure due to derivative positions taken for hedging purposes in excess of the underlying position against which the hedging position has been taken, shall be treated under the limits mentioned in point 1.
- viii. Definition of Exposure in case of Derivative Positions Each position taken in derivatives shall have an associated exposure as defined under. Exposure is the maximum possible loss that may occur on a position. However, certain derivative positions may theoretically have unlimited possible loss. Exposure in derivative positions shall be computed as follows:

All investment restrictions shall be applicable at the time of making investment.

The Trustee may alter the above restrictions from time to time to the extent of changes in the Regulations.

Changes in Fundamental Attributes:

In accordance with Regulation 18(15A) of the SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996 and paragraph 1.14.1.4 of the Master Circular, the Trustees shall ensure that no change in the fundamental attributes of the Scheme(s) and the Plan(s) / Option(s) thereunder or the trust or fee and expenses payable or any other change which would modify the Scheme(s) and the Plan(s) / Option(s) thereunder and affect the interests of Unitholders is carried out unless it complies with sub-regulation (26) of regulation 25 of these regulations.

In accordance to regulation 25(26) of the SEBI (MF) Regulations, the Asset management company shall ensure that no change in the fundamental attributes of any scheme or the trust, fees and expenses payable or any other change which would modify the scheme and affect the interest of unit holders, shall be carried out unless:

- An application has been made with SEBI and views/comments of SEBI are sought on the proposal for fundamental attribute changes;
- An addendum to the existing SID shall be issued and displayed on AMC website immediately,
- SID shall be revised and updated immediately after completion of duration of the exit option (not less than 30 days),
- A public notice shall be given in respect of such changes in one English daily newspaper having nationwide circulation as well as in a newspaper published in the language of region where the Head Office of the Mutual Fund is situated, and the Unitholders are given an option for a period of 30 days to exit at the prevailing Net Asset Value without any exit load.

D. Index methodology

About Nifty Midcap 150 Index:

NSE Indices Limited, a subsidiary of NSE, has developed Nifty Midcap 150 Index represents the next 150 companies (companies ranked 101-250) based on full market capitalisation from Nifty 500. This index intends to measure the performance of mid-market capitalisation companies. The selection of securities and weights are based on Periodic Capped Free Float methodology.

Eligibility Criteria:

The eligible universe includes:

- Companies should form part of Nifty 500 at the time of review
- In case of reconstitution of child indices, latest index composition including most recent changes in respective parent index whether announced or yet to be announced shall be considered. Child indices are defined as those indices where constituents are selected from a list of any other index. Example: Nifty Auto would be considered as a child index as constituents of Nifty Auto are selected from a list of Nifty 500 index.
- Minimum number of stocks within the index should be 10.
- In case, the number of eligible stocks within Nifty 500 falls below 10, then deficit number of stocks shall be selected from the universe of stocks ranked within top 800 based on both average daily turnover and average daily full market capitalisation based on previous six months period data used for index rebalancing of Nifty 500, provided company meets the eligibility criteria of having minimum listing history of 1 calendar month and 90% trading frequency as the data cut-off date. Further, in case the number of eligible stocks in the universe is still less than 10, then the deficit number of stocks shall be selected from the universe of stocks ranked within top 1000, top 1100, top 1200 and so on, based on both average daily turnover and average daily full market capitalization based on previous six months period data, until at least 10 eligible stocks are obtained, subject to fulfilment of other inclusion criteria. If the number of eligible stocks is still less than 10, then the index may have less than 10 constituents
- Companies should form part of respective sector universe
- In case of Nifty Bank index, companies that are allowed to trade in F&O segment at NSE are only eligible to be a constituent of the index while for all the other sector indices, a preference shall be given to companies that are available for trading in NSE's Futures & Options segment at the time of final selection
- In case of Nifty Financial Services, a preference within each subsector shall be given to companies that are available for trading in NSE's Futures & Options segment
- On a prospective basis, Non F&O stocks are eligible for inclusion only if the total instances of the stock hitting the upper or lower circuit (price band)* during the past 6 months as of the cut-off date is less than 20% of the number of total trading days over the same period *An instance is counted each time the stock hits the upper or lower price circuit on a given trading day. If a stock hits the upper and lower price circuit (price band) on the same trading day, it will be counted as two instances
- The companies are sorted in the descending order of the average free-float market capitalization (FF market capitalization) and final selection of companies shall be made based on the FF market capitalization to form part of the index
- Companies will be included if free-float market capitalisation is at least 1.5 times the free float market capitalization of the smallest index constituent in respective index

Index Service Provider: Nifty Indices

Impact cost of constituents: The individual constituent of the index shall have an average impact cost of 1% or less over previous six months.

PROCEDURE FOR CREATION OF UNITS

Issue of Units

- 1. Each unit of the Scheme will be approximately equal to 1/1000th of the Underlying Index closing on the date of allotment. The units being offered will be issued at a premium approximately equal to the difference between face value and allotment price.
- 2. As the Scheme will be listed on BSE/NSE, subsequent buying or selling by investors can be made from the secondary market on BSE/NSE. The minimum number of units that can be bought or sold is 1 (one) unit.
- 3. Authorised Participant(s)/ Investor(s) can directly buy / sell in blocks from the Fund in 'Creation Unit' Size subject to minimum application amount.

Creation of Units:

'Creation Unit' is a fixed number of Units of the Scheme, which is exchanged for a predefined basket of shares underlying the index called the "Portfolio Deposit" and a

"Cash Component". The facility of creating / redeeming units in Creation Unit size is available to the Eligible Investors:

The number of units, that investors can create / redeem in exchange of the Portfolio Deposit and Cash Component, is 3,50,000 Units and in multiples thereof. The Portfolio Deposit and Cash Component are defined as follows:-

- a. Portfolio Deposit: This is a pre-defined basket of securities that represent the Underlying Index. Portfolio Deposit can change from time to time. The Portfolio Deposit may vary on account of market movements and other related factors.
- b. Cash Component for subscription/ redemption in Creation Unit: The Cash Component represents the difference between the applicable net asset value of a Creation Unit and the market value of the Portfolio Deposit. This difference may include accrued dividends, accrued annual charges including management fees and residual cash in the Scheme. In addition, the Cash Component may include transaction cost as charged by the Custodian/Depository Participant, equalization of dividend, effect of rounding-off of number of shares in Portfolio Deposit and other incidental expenses for Creating Units. The Cash Component will vary from time to time and will be computed and announced by the AMC on its website every Business Day.

Example of Creation and Redemption of Units of ICICI Prudential Nifty Midcap 150 ETF

The Creation Unit is made up of 2 components i.e. the Portfolio Deposit and the Cash Component. The Portfolio Deposit will be determined by the Fund as per the weightages of each security in the Underlying Index. The value of this portfolio deposit will change due to change in prices during the day. The number of shares of each security that constitute the portfolio deposit will remain constant unless there is any corporate action in the Underlying Index/ change in the constituents of the Underlying Index.

In addition, Investors shall also pay charges payable to depositories / exchanges for creation / redemption of units as part of Cash Component.

The above is just an example to illustrate the calculation of Cash Component. Cash Component will vary depending upon the actual charges incurred like Custodial Charges and other incidental charges for creating units.

E. Principles of incentive structure for market makers

Pursuant to SEBI Circular no. SEBI/HO/IMD/DOF2/P/CIR/2022/69 dated May 23, 2022 on "Development of Passive Funds", the principles of incentive structure pertaining to Market Makers (MMs) as mentioned below:

- i. Incentives, if any, to Market Makers (MMs) shall be charged to the scheme within the maximum permissible limit of total expense ratio (TER).
- ii. AMC may determine the incentives basis the performance of MMs in terms of generating liquidity in units of ETFs.
- iii. Incentives to MMs may be variable in nature or fixed amount basis agreed performance standards between the AMC and MMs.

All the IDCW payments shall be in accordance and compliance with SEBI Regulations, as applicable from time to time.

Equalization Reserve Account: When units are sold, and sale price (NAV) is higher than face value of the unit, a portion of sale price that represents realized gains is credited to an Equalization Reserve Account and which can be used to pay IDCW. IDCW can be distributed out of investors capital (Equalization Reserve), which is part of sale price that represents realized gains.

Allotment (Detailed procedure)

The AMC shall display prominently on the AMC's website link of the scheme wise annual report and physical copy of the same shall be made available to the unitholders at the registered / corporate office of the AMC at all times.

5. Half - Yearly Financial Results

The AMC shall within one month from the close of each half year, that is on 31st March and on 30th September, host a soft copy of its unaudited financial results on their website. Further, the AMC shall publish an advertisement disclosing the hosting of such financial results on their website, in atleast one English daily newspaper having nationwide circulation and in a newspaper having wide circulation published in the language of the region where the Head Office of the mutual fund is situated.

6. Disclosure on Riskometers and Scheme Summary Document (SSD)

In accordance with paragraph 17.4 of the master circular Risk-o-meter shall be evaluated on a monthly basis and Mutual Funds/AMCs shall disclose the Risk-o-meter along with portfolio disclosure for all their schemes on their respective website and on AMFI website within 10 days from the close of each month. Any change in risk-o-meter shall be communicated by way of Notice cum Addendum and by way of an e-mail or SMS to unitholders of that particular scheme.

Pursuant to Notification No. S.O. 1226(E) and G.S.R. 226(E) dated March 30, 2020 issued by Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance, Government of India, read with Part I of Chapter IV of Notification dated February 21, 2019 issued by Legislative Department, Ministry of Law and Justice, Government of India on the Finance Act, 2019, a stamp duty @ 0.005% of the transaction value would be levied on applicable mutual fund transactions, with effect from July 1, 2020. Accordingly, pursuant to levy of stamp duty, the number of units allotted on purchase transactions (including IDCW reinvestment) to the unitholders would be reduced to that extent.
