XXVI Applicable NAV

(i) For Market Makers / Large Investors only:

A. Subscription (Purchase)

The number of Units of the Scheme that Investors can create in exchange of the Portfolio Deposit and Cash Component is on the basis of creation unit size of the Scheme. Units of the Scheme in less than Creation Unit size cannot be purchased directly with the Fund.

The Fund may allow cash (through RTGS/transfer/Cheque) Purchases of Units of the Scheme in Creation Unit size by Large Investors/Market Makers. Purchase request for Creation Unit shall be made by such Investor to the Fund/AMC where upon the Fund/AMC will arrange to buy the underlying portfolio Securities on behalf of the Investor. The Portfolio Deposit and Cash Component will be exchanged for the Units of the Scheme in Creation Unit size.

B. Redemption (Sale)

The Fund may allow cash Redemption of the Units of the Scheme in Creation Unit size by Large Investors/Market Makers. Such Investors shall make Redemption request to the Fund/AMC whereupon the Fund/AMC will arrange to sell underlying portfolio Securities on behalf of the Investor. Accordingly, the sale proceeds of portfolio Securities, after adjusting necessary charges/costs, will be remitted to the Investor.

(ii) For others (except Market Makers / Large Investors):

Applicable NAV is the Net Asset Value per Unit at the close of the Business Day on which the application for purchase or redemption/switch is received at the OPAT of SBI MF and is considered accepted on that day. An application is considered accepted on that day, subject to it being complete in all respects and received prior to the cut-off time on that Business Day.

Part II. INFORMATION ABOUT THE SCHEME

A. HOW WILL THE SCHEME ALLOCATE ITS ASSETS?

This includes asset allocation table giving the broad classification of assets and indicative exposure level in percentage terms. The asset allocation should be consistent with the investment objective of the scheme and SEBI circulars on Categorization and Rationalization of Mutual Fund Schemes.

The cumulative gross exposure through Equities, Money Market Instruments including Triparty repo, units of Liquid mutual funds and derivatives (gross notional exposure) shall not exceed 100%.

The scheme will not make any investment in ADR/ GDR/ Foreign Securities/ Securitised Debt. The Scheme will not make any investment in debt instruments having structured obligations.

The Scheme shall not invest in repo in corporate debt

The Scheme shall not engage in short selling.

The Scheme shall not invest in unrated debt instrument.

The Scheme may engage in stock lending and borrowing upto 20% of net assets of the scheme.

The cumulative exposure of equities, money market securities including Triparty Repo, units of Liquid mutual funds and gross notional exposure of derivatives instruments and such other securities/assets as may be permitted by the Board from time to time, subject to prior approval from SEBI, if required, should not exceed 100% of the net assets of the scheme in accordance with Paragraph 12.24 of SEBI Master Circular for Mutual funds. However, in accordance with Paragraph 12.25.3 of Master Circular for Mutual Funds and SEBI letter no. SEBI/ HO/ IMD – II/ DOF3 / OW/ P/ 2021/ 31487/ 1 dated November 3, 2021 addressed to AMFI, it has been mentioned that cash or cash equivalents like Government securities, T-Bills and repo on Government Securities with residual maturity of less than 91 days may be treated as not creating any exposure.

This investment in units of liquid mutual fund is subject to prevailing regulatory limits of aggregate interscheme investment made by all schemes under the same management or in schemes under the management of any other asset management company which shall not exceed 5% of the net asset value of the mutual fund.

The Investment Manager would monitor the tracking error of the Scheme on an ongoing basis and would seek to minimize tracking error to the maximum extent possible. There can be no assurance or

guarantee that the Scheme will achieve any particular level of tracking error relative to performance of the Underlying Index.

The proportion of the scheme portfolio invested in each type of security will vary in accordance with economic conditions, interest rates, liquidity and other relevant considerations, including the risks associated with each investment. Change in asset allocation:

As per para 1.14.1.2 of SEBI master circular dated June 27, 2024, the above investment pattern is indicative and may be changed by the Fund Manager for a short term period on defensive considerations, keeping in view market conditions, market opportunities, applicable SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations 1996, legislative amendments and other political and economic factors, the intention being at all times to seek to protect the interests of the Unit Holders. If the exposure falls outside the above mentioned asset allocation pattern, the portfolio to be rebalanced by AMC within 7 days from the date of said deviation.

Portfolio rebalancing:

Pursuant to Paragraph 3.6.7 of Master Circular for Mutual Funds, in case of change in constituents of the underlying index due to periodic review, the portfolio to be rebalanced by AMC within 7 calendar days from the date of said deviation.

B. WHERE WILL THE SCHEME INVEST?

The Scheme will invest in securities which are constituents of Nifty Private Bank Index, Money Market instruments and units of liquid mutual fund.

Money Market instruments includes Commercial Paper, Commercial Bills, Certificates of Deposit, Treasury Bills, Bills Rediscounting, Triparty Repo, Government securities having an unexpired maturity of less than 1 year, alternate to Call or notice money, Usance Bills and any other such short-term instruments as may be allowed under the Regulations prevailing from time to time.

A brief narration of Money Market Instruments is as under:

- 1.Certificate of Deposits (CDs) is a negotiable money market instrument issued by scheduled commercial banks and select all- India Financial Institutions that have been permitted by the RBI to raise short term resources.
- 2. Commercial Paper (CPs) is an unsecured negotiable money market instrument issued in the form of a promissory note, generally issued by the corporates, primary dealers and all India Financial Institutions as an alternative source of short term borrowings. They are issued at a discount to the face value as may be determined by the issuer. CP is traded in secondary market and can be freely bought and sold before maturity.
- 3. Treasury Bills (T-Bills) are issued by the Government of India to meet their short term borrowing requirements. T-Bills are issued for maturities of 91 days, and 364 days. T-bills are issued at a discount to their face value and redeemed at par.
- 4. Triparty Repo
- 5. Securities created and issued by the Central Governments as may be permitted by RBI, securities guaranteed by the Central Governments (including but not limited to coupon bearing bonds, zero coupon bonds and treasury bills). Central Government Securities are sovereign debt obligations of the Government of India with zero-risk of default and issued on its behalf by RBI. They form part of Government's annual borrowing programme and are used to fund the fiscal deficit along with other short term and long term requirements. Such securities could be fixed rate, fixed interest rate with put/call option, zero coupon bond, floating rate bonds, capital indexed bonds, Fixed Interest security with staggered maturity payment etc.

The Fund Manager reserves the right to invest in such instruments and securities as may be permitted from time to time and which are in line with the investment objective of the scheme.

C. WHAT ARE THE INVESTMENT STRATEGIES?

The Scheme will track Nifty Private Bank Index and will use a "passive" or indexing approach to endeavor to achieve scheme's investment objective. Unlike other funds, the scheme will not try to "beat" the market it tracks and do not seek temporary defensive positions when market decline or appear overvalued. The AMC does not make any judgments about the investment merit of a particular security nor will it attempt to apply any economic, financial or market analysis. Indexing eliminates active management risks with regard to over/ underperformance vis-à-vis a benchmark.

Since the scheme is an exchange traded fund, the scheme will only invest in the securities constituting the underlying index. However, due to changes in underlying index the scheme may temporarily hold securities which are not part of the index. For example, the portfolio may hold securities not included in the respective underlying index as result of certain changes in the underlying index such as reconstitution, addition, deletion etc. The fund manager's endeavor would be to rebalance the portfolio in order to mirror the index; however, there may be a short period where the constituents of the portfolio may differ from that of the underlying index.

These investments which fall outside the underlying index shall be rebalanced within a period of 7 calendar days.

Derivative products are leveraged instruments and can provide disproportionate gains as well as disproportionate losses to the investor. Execution of such strategies depends upon the ability of the fund manager to identify such

opportunities. Identification and execution of the strategies to be pursued by the fund manager involve uncertainty and decision of fund manager may not always be profitable. No assurance can be given that the fund manager will be able to identify or execute such strategies.

The risks associated with the use of derivatives are different from or possibly greater than, the risks associated with investing directly in securities and other traditional investments.

The Trustee/AMC reserves the right to change the benchmark for the evaluation of the performance of the Scheme from time to time, keeping in mind the investment objective of the Scheme and the appropriateness of the benchmark, subject to SEBI guidelines and other prevalent guidelines.



In accordance with Regulation 25(16A), the asset management company shall invest such amounts in such schemes of the mutual fund, based on the risks associated with the schemes, as may be specified by the Board from time to time.

A. COMPUTATION OF NAV

NAVs of the Scheme shall be computed and declared on every business day. The NAV under the Scheme would be rounded off to 4 decimals and Units will be allotted upto four decimal places as follows or such other formula as may be prescribed by SEBI from time to time:

Illustration on computation of NAV: If the net assets of the Scheme are Rs.10,45,34,345.34 and units outstanding are 10,000,000, then the NAV per unit will be computed as follows: 10,45,34,345.34 / 10,000,000 = Rs. 10.4534 p.u. (rounded off to four decimals)

NAV will be disclosed in the manner as specified prescribed under SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996. NAV can also be viewed on www.sbimf.com and www.amfiindia.com.

The AMC shall update the NAVs on the website of Association of Mutual Funds in India - AMFI (www.amfiindia.com) by 11.00 p.m. In case of any delay, the reasons for such delay would be explained to AMFI and SEBI by the next day. If the NAVs are not available before commencement of business hours on the following day due to any reason, the Fund shall issue a press release providing reasons and explaining when the Fund would be able to publish the NAVs.

Further, as per SEBI Regulations, the repurchase price shall not be lower than 95% of the NAV

Methodology for calculation of sale and re-purchase price of the units of mutual fund scheme:

Let's assume that the NAV of a Mutual Fund Scheme on April 01, 2018 is Rs. 10/-.

Purchase of mutual fund units:

The Purchase Price of the Units on an ongoing basis will be same as Applicable NAV.

Purchase Price = Applicable NAV

In the above example, purchase is done on April 01, 2018, when the Applicable NAV = Rs. 10/-Therefore, Purchase Price = Rs. 10/-

As per existing Regulations, no entry load is charged with respect to applications for purchase / additional purchase of mutual funds units.

Redemption/Re-purchase of mutual fund units

The Redemption Price of the Units will be calculated on the basis of the Applicable NAV subject to prevailing Exit Load, if any. In case of redemption, the amount payable to the investor shall be calculated as follows:

Redemption Price = Applicable NAV * (1 - Exit Load)

Say, in the above example the exit load applicable is:

- a. For exit on or before 12 months from the date of allotment 1.00%
- b. For exit after 12 months from the date of allotment Nil.

Scenario 1: Redemption is done during applicability of exit load

In case the investor requests for redemption on or before 12 months i.e. on or before March 31, 2019; say December 1, 2018, when the NAV of the scheme is Rs. 12/- and the exit load applicable is 1%, so the Redemption amount payable to investor shall be calculated as follows:

```
Redemption Price = Applicable NAV * (1 - Exit Load)
= Rs. 12 * (1-1%) = Rs. 11.988/-
```

Scenario 2: Redemption is done when the exit load is NIL

In case the investor requests for redemption after 12 months i.e. after March 31, 2019; say April 1, 2019, when the NAV of the scheme is Rs. 12/- and the exit load applicable is NIL, so the Redemption amount payable to investor shall be calculated as follows:

```
Redemption Price = Applicable NAV * (1 - Exit Load)
= Rs. 12 * (1-0) = Rs. 12/-
```

The aforesaid example does not take into consideration any applicable statutory levies or taxes. Accordingly, the redemption amount payable to investor shall further reduce to the extent of applicable statutory levies or taxes.

The AMC has estimated that upto 1.00% incurred towards different heads mentioned under regulations (2) and (4) of Regulation 52 of SEBI Regulations) of the daily net assets will be charged to the scheme as expenses. The maximum annual recurring expenses that can be charged to the Scheme, excluding issue or redemption expenses, whether initially borne by the mutual fund or by the asset management company, but including the investment management and advisory fee shall be within the limits stated in Regulations 52 read with paragraph 10.1.12 of SEBI master circular for Mutual Funds dated June 27, 2024. The AMC may charge the investment and advisory fees within the limits of total expenses prescribed under Regulation 52 of the SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations

Further, in terms of paragraph 10.1.14 of SEBI Master Circular for Mutual funds dated June 27, 2024, any payment towards brokerage and transaction cost, over and above the said 12 bps and 5bps for cash market transactions and derivatives transactions respectively may be charged to the scheme within the maximum limit of Total Expense Ratio (TER) as prescribed under regulation 52 of the SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996. - b) Expenses not exceeding of 0.30 per cent of daily net assets will be charged, if the new inflows from such cities as specified from time to time are at least –
- (i) 30 percent of gross new inflows in the scheme, or;
- (ii) 15 percent of the average assets under management (year to date) of the scheme, whichever is higher: Provided that if inflows from such cities is less than the higher of sub-clause (i) or sub- clause (ii), such expenses on daily net assets of the scheme shall be charged on proportionate basis:
 - Provided further that expenses charged under this clause shall be utilised for distribution expenses incurred for bringing inflows from such cities:
 - Provided further that amount incurred as expense on account of inflows from such cities shall be credited back to the scheme in case the said inflows are redeemed within a period of one year from the date of investment.

The Goods & service tax on investment management and advisory fees would be charged in addition to above limit. Further, GST on expenses other than investment and advisory fees shall be borne by the Scheme within the maximum limit of annual recurring expenses as prescribed in Regulation 52.

I. Introduction

A. Definitions/interpretation

B. Risk factors

Scheme specific risk factors:

a. The Scheme would be investing in Securities covered by Nifty Private Bank Index and Money Market instruments including commercial papers, commercial bills, treasury bills, Government securities having an unexpired maturity up to one year, call or notice money, certificate of deposit, usance bills, and any other like instruments as specified by the Reserve Bank of India from time to time and units of liquid mutual fund. The liquidity of the scheme's investments is inherently restricted by trading volumes and settlement periods. In the event of an inordinately large number of redemption requests, or of a restructuring of the scheme's investment portfolio, these periods may become significant. In view of the same, the right to limit redemptions (including suspending redemptions) under certain circumstances will be in accordance with Paragraph 1.12 of SEBI Master Circular.

b. Risks associated with ETFs:

- The Scheme will be a passively managed ETF and may be affected by a general decline in the Indian markets relating to its Underlying Index. The Scheme invests in the securities included in its Underlying Index regardless of their investment merit. The AMC does not attempt to individually select stocks or to take defensive positions in declining markets.
- The scheme will be listed on NSE Limited, however, there can be no assurance that an active secondary market will develop or be maintained.
- Investment in ETFs is subject to tracking error. Factors such as the fees and expenses of the Scheme, corporate actions, cash balance, changes to the Underlying Index and regulatory policies may affect the AMC's ability to achieve close correlation with the Underlying Index of the Scheme. The AMC will endeavor to constantly minimize the tracking error and track the index as closely as possible.

c. Investments under the scheme may also be subject to the following risks:

I. Investment in Equities:

- a. Equity and Equity related instruments are volatile in nature and are subject to price fluctuations on daily basis. The volatility in the value of the equity and equity related instruments is due to various micro and macro-economic factors affecting the securities markets. This may have adverse impact on individual securities /sector and consequently on the NAV of Scheme.
- b. The inability of the Scheme to make intended securities purchases due to settlement problems could cause the Scheme to miss certain investment opportunities as in certain cases, settlement periods may be extended significantly by unforeseen circumstances. Similarly, the inability to sell securities held in the scheme portfolio may result, at times, in potential losses to the scheme, should there be a subsequent decline in the value of the securities held in the scheme portfolio.
- c. Trading volumes, settlement periods and transfer procedures may restrict the liquidity of the investments made by the scheme. Different segments of the Indian financial markets have different settlement periods and such periods may be extended significantly by unforeseen circumstances leading to delays in receipt of proceeds from sale of securities.
- d. **Risk pertaining to Nifty Private Bank Index**: Nifty Private Bank Index comprises of well diversified stocks. Equities are volatile in nature and are subject to price fluctuations on daily basis. The volatility in the value

of the equity instruments is due to various micro and macroeconomic factors affecting the securities markets. This may have adverse impact on individual securities /sector and consequently on the NAV of Scheme.

II. Risk associated with investing in Fixed Income Securities

- a. Credit risk: Credit risk or default risk refers to the risk which may arise due to default on the part of the issuer of the fixed income security (i.e. will be unable to make timely principal and interest payments on the security). Because of this risk debentures are sold at a yield spread above those offered on Treasury securities, which are sovereign obligations and generally considered to be free of credit risk. Normally, the value of a fixed income security will fluctuate depending upon the actual changes in the perceived level of credit risk as well as the actual event of default.
- b. Interest Rate risk: This risk is associated with movements in interest rate depends on various factors such as government borrowing, inflation, economic performance etc. The value of investments will appreciate/depreciate if the interest rates fall/rise. However, if the investments are held on till maturity of the investments, the value of the investments will not be subjected to this risk.
- c. Reinvestment risk: This risk arises from uncertainty in the rate at which cash flows from the securities may be reinvested. This is because the bond will pay coupons, which will have to be reinvested. The rate at which the coupons will be reinvested will depend upon prevailing market rates at the time the coupons are received.
- d. Liquidity or Marketability Risk: This refers to the ease at which a security can be sold at or near its true value. The primary measure of liquidity risk is the spread between the bid price and the offer price quoted by a dealer. Liquidity risk is characteristic of the Indian fixed income market.
- e. Different types of fixed income securities in which the Scheme would invest carry different levels and types of risk. Accordingly, the Scheme risk may increase or decrease depending upon its investment pattern. e.g. corporate bonds carry a higher level of risk than Government securities. Further even among corporate bonds, bonds, which are AAA rated, are comparatively less risky than bonds, which are AA rated
- f. The Net Asset Value (NAV) of the Scheme, to the extent invested in Money Market securities, will be affected by changes in the general level of interest rates. The NAV of the Scheme is expected to increase from a fall in interest rates while it would be adversely affected by an increase in the level of interest rates.

III. Market Trading Risks

- 1. **Absence of Prior Active Market**: Although the scheme will be listed on stock exchange, there can be no assurance that an active secondary market will develop or be maintained.
- 2. Lack of Market Liquidity: Trading in the units of the scheme on stock exchange may be halted because of market conditions or for reasons that in view of stock exchange or SEBI, trading in the units of the scheme are not advisable. In addition, trading of the units of the scheme are subject to trading halts caused by extraordinary market volatility and pursuant to stock exchange and SEBI 'circuit filter' rules. There can be no assurance that the requirements of stock exchange necessary to maintain the listing of the units of the scheme will continue to be met or will remain unchanged.
- 3. Units of the scheme may trade at prices other than NAV: The units of the scheme may trade above or below their NAV. The NAV of the scheme will fluctuate with changes in the market value of scheme holdings. The trading prices of the units of the scheme will fluctuate in accordance with changes in their NAV as well as market supply and demand for the units of the scheme. However, given that units of the scheme can be created and redeemed in creation units directly with the fund, it is expected that large discounts or premiums to the NAV of units of the scheme will not sustain due to arbitrage opportunity available
- 4. **Regulatory Risk**: Any changes in trading regulations by stock exchange or SEBI may affect the ability of market maker to arbitrage resulting into wider premium/discount to NAV.
- 5. **Right to Limit Redemptions:** The Trustee, in the general interest of the unit holders of the scheme and keeping in view of the unforeseen circumstances/unusual market conditions, may limit the total number of units which can be redeemed on any business day depending on the total "Saleable Underlying Stock" available with the fund. For details, refer Section on 'Right to limit Redemption' in B. ONGOING OFFER DETAILS mentioned below

- 6. **Redemption Risk**: Investors may note that even though the Scheme is open-ended Scheme, the Scheme would ordinarily repurchase units in creation unit size. Thus unit holdings less than the creation unit size can only be sold through the secondary market on the exchange.
- 7. As the scheme proposes to invest not less than 95% of the net assets in securities comprising of Nifty Private Bank Index, any deletion of stocks from or addition to Nifty Private Bank Index may require sudden and immediate liquidation or acquisition of such stocks at the prevailing market prices irrespective of whether valuation of stocks is attractive enough. This may not always be in the interest of unitholders.
- 8. **Asset Class Risk**: The returns from the types of securities in which the scheme invest may underperform returns of general securities markets or different asset classes. Different types of securities tend to go through cycles of out-performance and under-performance in comparison of securities markets.
- 9. The units will be issued only in demat form through depositories. The records of the depository are final with respect to the number of units available to the credit of unit holder. Settlement of trades, repurchase of units by the mutual fund depends up on the confirmations to be received from depository (ies) on which the mutual fund has no control.

10. Tracking Error Risk:

The Fund Manager may not be able to invest the entire corpus exactly in the same proportion as in the underlying index due to certain factors such as the fees and expenses of the Scheme, corporate actions, cash balance, changes to the underlying index and regulatory policies which may affect AMC's ability to achieve close correlation with the underlying index of the scheme. The scheme's returns may therefore deviate from those of its underlying index.

The tracking error i.e. the annualized standard deviation of the difference in daily returns between the underlying index or goods and the NAV of the ETF/ Index Fund (other than Debt ETFs/ Index Funds) based on past one year rolling data shall not exceed 2%. In case of unavoidable circumstances in the nature of force majeure, which are beyond the control of the AMCs, the tracking error may exceed 2% and the same shall be brought to the notice of Trustees with corrective actions taken by the AMC, if any.

11.Tracking Difference Risk

The Fund Manager may not be able to invest the entire corpus exactly in the same proportion as in the underlying index due to certain factors such as the fees and expenses of the scheme, corporate actions, cash balance, changes to the underlying index and regulatory policies which may affect AMC's ability to achieve close correlation with the underlying index of the scheme. The scheme's returns may therefore deviate from those of its underlying index.

Tracking Difference is the Difference of returns between the Scheme and the Benchmark Index anualized over 1 year, 3 Year, 5 Year,10 year and Scheme Since Inception period. It will be the endeavor of the fund manager to keep the tracking difference as low as possible.

Tracking Difference shall be disclosed only if the scheme has completed 1 year period.

Tracking difference is to be disclosed on a monthly basis on www.sbimf.com and AMFI website.

IV. Risks pertaining to transaction in units through Stock Exchange Mechanism:

Lack of Market Liquidity: The Scheme may not be able to immediately sell certain types of illiquid Securities. The purchase price and subsequent valuation of restricted and illiquid Securities may reflect a discount, which may be significant, from the market price of comparable Securities for which a liquid market exists.

V. Passive Investments:

As the scheme proposes to invest not less than 95% of the net assets in the securities of the underlying Index, the scheme will not be actively managed. The Scheme may be affected by a general decline in the Indian markets relating to its Underlying Index. The Scheme invests in the securities included in its underlying index regardless of their investment merit. The AMC does not attempt to individually select securities or to take defensive positions in declining markets.

VI. The scheme restricts its investments only in the Securities of the underlying index which represents a particular sector/theme and will therefore be subject to the risks associated with such concentration. The

sector, under certain market conditions, could underperform returns from securities included in a broad market equity index or other asset classes. Also, the number of stocks in underlying index is low and hence the concentration on a few large cap stocks could be significantly high. Due to such sector and stock specific concentration the scheme could be exposed to higher levels of volatility and market risk than would generally be the case in a more diverse fund portfolio of equity securities.

d. Risks associated with investment in units of mutual fund:

Investment in Mutual Fund Units involves investment risks, including but not limited to risks such as liquidity risk, volatility risk, default risk including the possible loss of principal.

- Liquidity risk The liquidity of the scheme's investments is inherently restricted by trading volumes and settlement periods. In the event of an inordinately large number of redemption requests, or of a restructuring of the scheme's investment portfolio, these periods may become significant. In view of the same, the Trustees may limit redemptions (including suspending redemptions) under certain circumstances as specified under the Scheme Information Document.
- Volatility risks: There is the risk of volatility in markets due to external factors like liquidity flows, changes in the business environment, economic policy etc. The scheme will manage volatility risk through diversification across companies and sectors within PSUs.
- Default risk Credit risk is risk resulting from uncertainty in counterparty's ability or willingness to meet its
 contractual obligations. This risk pertains to the risk of default of payment of principal and interest.
 Government Securities have zero credit risk while other debt instruments are rated according to the issuer's
 ability to meet the obligations.

e. Risk Associated with investing in derivatives

- a. The AMC, on behalf of the Scheme may use various derivative products, from time to time, in an attempt to protect the value of the portfolio and enhance unit holders' interest. Investors should understand that derivative products are specialized instruments that require investment techniques and risk analysis different from those associated with stocks and bonds. The use of a derivative requires an understanding not only of the underlying instrument but of the derivative itself. Other risks include but are not limited to the risk of mispricing or improper valuation and the inability of derivatives to correlate perfectly with underlying assets, rates and indices. There may be a cost attached to selling or buying futures or another derivative instrument. Further there could be an element of settlement risk, which could be different from the risk in settling physical shares. The possible lack of a liquid secondary market for a futures contract or listed option may result in inability to close futures or listed option positions prior to their maturity date.
- b. Derivative products are leveraged instruments and can provide disproportionate gains as well as disproportionate losses to the investor. Execution of such strategies depends upon the ability of the fund manager to identify such opportunities. Identification and execution of the strategies to be pursued by the fund manager involve uncertainty and decision of fund manager may not always be profitable.
- c. No assurance can be given that the fund manager will be able to identify or execute such strategies. The risks associated with the use of derivatives are different from or possibly greater than, the risks associated with investing directly in securities and other traditional investments.
- d. The derivatives will entail a counter-party risk to the extent of amount that can become due from the party.
- e. An exposure to derivatives can also limit the profits from a genuine investment transaction.
- f. Efficiency of a derivatives market depends on the development of a liquid and efficient market for underlying securities and also on the suitable and acceptable benchmarks.
- g. The risks associated with the use of derivatives are different from or possibly greater than, the risks associated with investing directly in securities and other traditional investments

f. Risk associated with Securities Lending:

Securities Lending is a lending of securities through an approved intermediary to a borrower under an agreement for a specified period with the condition that the borrower will return equivalent securities of the same type or class at the end of the specified period along with the corporate benefits accruing on the securities borrowed. There are risks inherent in securities lending, including the risk of failure of the other party, in which case the securities might go in for auction. In the event of exceptional circumstances resulting in non-availability of

securities in auction, such transactions would be financially closed-out at appropriate rates as per exchange regulations. Besides, there will also be temporary illiquidity of the securities that are lent out and the Scheme(s) will not be able to sell such lent out securities until they are returned.

g. Risks associated with segregated portfolio

Different types of securities in which the scheme would invest carry different levels and types of risk as given in the Scheme Information Document of the scheme. In addition to the same, unitholders are requested to also note the following risks with respect to Segregated Portfolio:

- 1. Investor holding units of segregated portfolio may not able to liquidate their holding till the time there is recovery of money from the issuer.
- 2. Listing of units of segregated portfolio in recognized stock exchange does not necessarily guarantee their liquidity, as there may not be active trading of units in the stock market. Further trading price of units on the stock market may be at a significant discount compared to the prevailing NAV.
- 3. Securities which are part of the segregated portfolio may or may not recover any money, either fully or partially.

h. Partial Execution Risk:

When Markets Makers or large investors come directly to the AMC for creation/ redemption in creation/redemption in unit size, there could be instances of corporate action such as merger/ demerger of companies or market volatility due to which certain stocks may hit the upper or lower circuit or may be unavailable for trade. While the endeavour is to completely replicate the constituents of the underlying index, it may not be possible at times in the above mentioned scenarios. This may have a bearing on processes such as, including but not limited to, the usual unit allotment timelines, price at which the particular stock may be allocated to the investor, refund timelines etc. and may impact the tracking error as well.

i. Risks associated with investment in TREPs:

a. Interest rate risk: This risk arises from uncertainty in the rate at which cash flows from the securities may be reinvested. While the rate of interest for TREPs remains closely correlated to the repo rate, it also may vary based on inter-bank lending demand & supply. Hence, there remains a risk of rate at which TREPs will get re-invested. b. Settlement risk: Since the settlement for TREPs happens through CCIL, the risk of default from counterparty is limited. However, in case a clearing member fails to honour their settlement obligations, the "Default Waterfall" mechanism is used to make complete the settlement process. As per the waterfall mechanism, 1st step. the defaulter's margins and the defaulter's contribution to the default fund have been appropriated; 2nd step: CCIL's contribution is used to meet the losses; 3rd step: Post utilization of CCIL's contribution if there is a residual loss, it is appropriated from the default fund contributions of the nondefaulting members. Hence, the scheme is subject to the risk of loss to the extent of initial margin and default fund contribution being invoked in the event of failure of any settlement obligations.

Sector Risk: The Scheme restricts its investments only in the Securities of the underlying index which represents a particular sector and will therefore be subject to the risks associated with such concentration. The banking sector, under certain market conditions, could underperform returns from Securities included in a broad market equity index or other asset classes. Also, the number of stocks in Nifty Private Bank index is low and hence the concentration on a few large cap stocks could be significantly high. Due to such sector and stock specific concentration the Scheme could be exposed to higher levels of volatility and market risk than would generally be the case in a more diverse fund portfolio of equity Securities.

C. Risk mitigation strategies

II. Information about the scheme:

A. Where will the scheme invest -

The Scheme will invest in securities which are constituents of Nifty Private Bank Index, Money Market instruments and units of liquid mutual fund.

Money Market instruments includes Commercial Paper, Commercial Bills, Certificates of Deposit, Treasury Bills, Bills Rediscounting, Triparty Repo, Government securities having an unexpired maturity of less than 1 year, alternate to Call or notice money, Usance Bills and any other such short-term instruments as may be allowed under the Regulations prevailing from time to time.

A brief narration of Money Market Instruments is as under:

- 1. Certificate of Deposits (CDs) is a negotiable money market instrument issued by scheduled commercial banks and select all- India Financial Institutions that have been permitted by the RBI to raise short term resources.
- 2. Commercial Paper (CPs) is an unsecured negotiable money market instrument issued in the form of a promissory note, generally issued by the corporates, primary dealers and all India Financial Institutions as an alternative source of short term borrowings. They are issued at a discount to the face value as may be determined by the issuer. CP is traded in secondary market and can be freely bought and sold before maturity.
- 3. Treasury Bills (T-Bills) are issued by the Government of India to meet their short term borrowing requirements. T-Bills are issued for maturities of 91 days, and 364 days. T-bills are issued at a discount to their face value and redeemed at par.
- 4. Triparty Repo
- 5. Securities created and issued by the Central Governments as may be permitted by RBI, securities guaranteed by the Central Governments (including but not limited to coupon bearing bonds, zero coupon bonds and treasury bills). Central Government Securities are sovereign debt obligations of the Government of India with zero-risk of default and issued on its behalf by RBI. They form part of Government's annual borrowing programme and are used to fund the fiscal deficit along with other short term and long term requirements. Such securities could be fixed rate, fixed interest rate with put/call option, zero coupon bond, floating rate bonds, capital indexed bonds, Fixed Interest security with staggered maturity payment etc.

The Fund Manager reserves the right to invest in such instruments and securities as may be permitted from time to time and which are in line with the investment objective of the scheme.

DEBT MARKET IN INDIA

The Indian debt markets are one of the largest and rapidly developing markets in Asia. Government and Public Sector enterprises are the predominant borrowers in the market. The debt markets have received lot of regulatory and governmental focus off late and are developing fast, with the rapid introduction of new instruments including derivatives. Foreign Portfolio Investors are also allowed to invest in Indian debt markets subject to ceiling levels announced by the government. There has been a considerable increase in the trading volumes in the market. The trading volumes are largely concentrated in the Government of India Securities, which contribute a significant proportion of the daily trades.

The money markets in India essentially consist of the call money market (i.e. market for overnight and term money between banks and institutions), repo transactions (temporary sale with an agreement to buy back the securities at a future date at a specified price), commercial papers (CPs, short term unsecured promissory notes, generally issued by corporates), certificate of deposits (CDs, issued by banks), Treasury Bills (issued by RBI) and the Triparty Repo.

Government securities are largely traded on a Negotiated Order Matching system (NDS OM) apart from the OTC market. The settlement of trades both in the Gsec markets and the overnight repo and TREPS are guaranteed and done by a central counterparty, the Clearing corporation of India (CCIL). Money market deals involving CD's and CP's are traded and settled on an OTC basis. The clearing and settlement of corporate bond deals are now routed through a central counterparty established by the exchanges BSE (ICCL) and NSE (NSCCL) which settles deals on a DVP (Delivery versus payment) non guaranteed basis.

The current market yields of various instruments and the factors affecting prices of such securities are given hereunder. The securitized instruments of higher ratings generally offer yields which are 50-75 basis points higher than the comparable normal debt instruments.

The interest rate market conditions are influenced by the Liquidity in the system, Credit growth, GDP growth, Inflows into the Country, Currency movement in the Forex market, demand and supply of issues and change in investors' preference. Generally, when there is a rise in interest rates the price of securities fall and vice versa. The extent of change in price shall depend on the rating, tenor to maturity, coupon and the extent of fall or rise in interest rates. The Government securities carry zero credit risk, but they carry interest rate risk like any other Fixed Income Securities. Money market instruments such as CP's and CD's which are fairly liquid are not listed in exchanges. The impact cost of offloading the various asset classes differ depending on market conditions and may impair the value of the securities to that extent. Further, investments in securitized instruments or structured obligation papers carry a higher illiquidity risk. They also carry limited recourse to the originator, delinquency risk out of the defaults on the receivables and prepayment risk which affects the yields on the instruments.

B. What are the investment restrictions?

The investment policies of the scheme comply with the rules, regulations and guidelines laid out in the SEBI Regulations. As per the Regulations, specifically the Seventh Schedule, the following investment limitations are applicable to schemes of Mutual Funds, as amended from time to time.

- a. Transfers of investments from one scheme to another scheme in the same mutual fund shall be allowed only if,
 - (i) such transfers are done at the prevailing market price for quoted instruments on spot basis. explanation "spot basis" shall have the same meaning as specified by the stock exchange for spot transactions,
 - (ii) the securities so transferred shall be in conformity with the investment objective of the scheme to which such transfer has been made.
- . (iii) For meeting liquidity requirement in a scheme in case of unanticipated redemption pressure
 - (iv) For Duration/Issuer/Sector/Group rebalancing
- b. The scheme shall not invest more than 10% of its NAV in debt instruments comprising money market instruments and non-money market instruments issued by a single issuer, which are rated not below investment grade by a credit rating agency authorized to carry out such activity under the Act. Such investment limit may be extended to 12% of the NAV of the scheme with the prior approval of the Board of Trustees and the Board of directors of the Asset Management Company.

Provided that such limit shall not be applicable for investments in government securities, treasury bills and

triparty repo on Government securities or treasury bills:

Provided further that investments within such limit can be made in mortgaged backed securitised debt which are rated not below investment grade by a credit rating agency registered with the Board:

Provided further that such limit shall not be applicable for investments in case of debt exchange traded funds or such other funds as may be specified by the Board from time to time.

However, the Scheme is an Exchange Traded Scheme, the investment in Money Market instruments shall be upto 5% of NAV.

A mutual fund scheme shall not invest more than:

- a. 10% of its NAV in debt and money market securities rated AAA; or
- b. 8% of its NAV in debt and money market securities rated AA; or
- c. 6% of its NAV in debt and money market securities rated A and below issued by a single issuer.

The above investment limits may be extended by up to 2% of the NAV of the scheme with prior approval of the Board of Trustees and Board of Directors of the AMC, subject to compliance with the overall 12% limit specified in clause 1 of Seventh Schedule of MF Regulation

c. A mutual fund scheme shall not invest in unlisted debt instruments including commercial papers, except Government Securities and other money market instruments.

Provided that Mutual Fund Schemes may invest in unlisted non-convertible debentures up to a maximum of 10% of the debt portfolio of the scheme subject to such conditions as may be specified by the Board from time to time

The mutual fund scheme shall comply with the norms under this clause within the time and in the manner as may be specified by SEBI.

The investment in unrated debt and money market instruments shall be as per the norms specified by SEBI from time to time.

- d. Debentures, irrespective of any residual maturity period (above or below one year), shall attract the investment restrictions as applicable for debt instruments
- e. A scheme may invest in another scheme under the same asset management company or any other mutual fund without charging any fees, provided that aggregate interscheme investment made by all schemes under the same management or in schemes under the management of any other asset management company shall not exceed 5% of the net asset value of the mutual fund.
- f. The Mutual Fund shall buy and sell securities on the basis of deliveries and shall in all cases of purchases, take delivery of relevant securities and in all cases of sale, deliver the securities. The Scheme may engage in Securities lending and the borrowing done shall be within the framework specified by the Board.

Provided further that a mutual fund may enter into derivatives transactions in a recognized stock exchange, subject to the framework specified by the Board.

Provided further that sale of government security already contracted for purchase shall be permitted in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Reserve Bank of India in this regard.

g. The Mutual Fund/AMC shall make investment out of the NFO proceeds only on or after the closure of the NFO period. The Mutual Fund/ AMC can however deploy the NFO proceeds in TREPS before the closure of NFO period. However, AMCs shall not charge any investment management and advisory fees on funds deployed in TREPS during the NFO period. The appreciation received from investment in TREPS shall be passed on to investors. Further, in case the minimum subscription amount is not garnered by the scheme during the NFO

period, the interest earned upon investment of NFO proceeds in TREPS shall be returned to investors, in proportion of their investments, along-with the refund of the subscription amount.

- h. The scheme shall not engage in in short selling of securities or carry forward transactions.
- i. The mutual fund under all its schemes will not own more than ten per cent of any company's paid up capital carrying voting rights.

Provided, investment in the asset management company or the trustee company of a mutual fund shall be governed by clause (a), of sub-regulation (1), of regulation 7B.

- j. Every mutual fund shall get the securities purchased or transferred in the name of the mutual fund on account of the concerned scheme, wherever investments are intended to be of long-term nature.
- k. Pending deployment of funds of the Scheme, the AMC may invest funds of the Scheme in short-term deposits of scheduled commercial banks, subject to the following conditions issued by SEBI in terms of para 12.16 of the Master Circulars for Mutual Funds dated June 27, 2024 as may be amended from time to time:
 - a. "Short Term" for parking of funds shall be treated as a period not exceeding 91 days.
 - b. Such short-term deposits shall be held in the name of the Scheme.
 - c. The Scheme shall not park more than 15% of their net assets in the short term deposit(s) of all the scheduled commercial banks put together. However, it may be raised to 20% with the prior approval of the Trustee. Also, parking of funds in short term deposits of associate and sponsor scheduled commercial banks together shall not exceed 20% of total deployment by the Mutual Fund in short term deposits.
 - d. The Scheme shall not park more than 10% of their net assets in short term deposit(s) with any one scheduled commercial bank including its subsidiaries.
 - e. The Trustee / AMC shall ensure that the funds of the Scheme are not parked in the short term deposits of a bank which has invested in the Scheme.
 - f. AMC will not charge any investment management and advisory fees for parking of funds in short term deposits of scheduled commercial banks.
 - g. The Trustee / AMC shall also ensure that the bank in which a scheme has short term deposits do not invest in the scheme until the scheme has short term deposits with such bank.

The above provisions do not apply to term deposits placed as margins for trading in cash and derivative market

- I. The scheme shall not make any investment in;
 - i. any unlisted security of an associate or group company of the sponsor; or
 - ii. any security issued by way of private placement by an associate or group company of the sponsor; or
 - iii. the listed securities of group companies of the sponsor which is in excess of 35% of the net assets.
- m. The scheme shall not make any investment in any Fund of Funds scheme.
- n. The Scheme will not invest in securitized debt.
- o. No loan would be made by the Scheme.
- p. The Mutual Fund shall enter into transactions relating to Government Securities only in dematerialised form.
- q. All investments by a mutual fund scheme in equity shares and equity related instruments shall only be made provided such securities are listed or to be listed.

C. Fundamental Attributes

Following are the Fundamental Attributes of the scheme, in terms of Clause 1.14 of SEBI Master Circular for Mutual Funds dated June 27, 2024 and Regulation 18 (15A) of the SEBI (MF) Regulations:

- (i) Type of a scheme An open-ended scheme tracking Nifty Private Bank Index
- (ii) <u>Investment Objective</u> The investment objective of the scheme is to provide return that closely correspond to the total returns of the securities as represented by the underlying index, subject to tracking error.

However, there is no guarantee or assurance that the investment objective of the scheme will be achieved.

(iii) Investment pattern- The indicative portfolio break-up with minimum and maximum asset allocation, while retaining the option to alter the asset allocation for a short term period on defensive considerations is detailed in Section II (C) of the SID.

(iii) Terms of Issue

Provisions in respect of Liquidity (as mentioned in Section III), Aggregate fees and expenses (as mentioned in Section IV) as indicated in this Scheme Information document.

(iv) Any Safety Net or Guarantee provided

This Scheme does not provide any guaranteed or assured return to its Investors.

In accordance with Regulation 18(15A) of the SEBI (MF) Regulations and Clause 1.14.1.4 of SEBI Master Circular for Mutual Funds dated June 27, 2024 the Trustees shall ensure that no change in the fundamental attributes of the Scheme(s) and the Plan(s) / Option(s) thereunder or the trust or fee and expenses payable or any other change which would modify the Scheme(s) and the Plan(s) / Option(s) thereunder and affect the interests of Unitholders is carried out unless:

SEBI has reviewed and provided its comments on the proposal

A written communication about the proposed change is sent to each Unitholder and an advertisement is given in one English daily newspaper having nationwide circulation as well as in a newspaper published in the language of the region where the Head Office of the Mutual Fund is situated; and

The Unitholders are given an option for a period of atleast 30 calendar days to exit at the prevailing Net Asset Value without any exit load.

D. Index methodology (for index funds, ETFs and FOFs having one underlying domestic ETF)-

The Nifty Private Bank Index is designed to reflect the behavior and performance of the banks from private sector. The index comprises of 10 stocks and weights of each company in the index were capped at 25% (until March 29, 2019).

Index Review Frequency

The review of index is undertaken semi-annually based on data for six months ending January and July.

Eligibility criteria:

To be considered for inclusion in indices listed above, companies must form part of eligible universe. The eligible universe includes:

- Companies should form part of Nifty 500 at the time of review.
- In case of reconstitution of child indices, latest index composition including most recent changes in respective parent index whether announced or yet to be announced shall be considered. Child indices are defined as those indices where constituents are selected from a list of any other index. Example: Nifty Auto would be considered as a child index as constituents of Nifty Infrastructure are selected from a list of Nifty 500 index.
- Minimum number of stocks within the index should be 10.
- In case, the number of eligible stocks within Nifty 500 falls below 10, then deficit number of stocks shall be
 selected from the universe of stocks ranked within top 800 based on both average daily turnover and
 average daily full market capitalisation based on previous six months period data used for index rebalancing
 of Nifty 500, provided company meets the eligibility criteria of having minimum listing history of 1 calendar
 month and 90% trading frequency as the data cut-off date
- Further, in case the number of eligible stocks in the universe is still less than 10, then the deficit number of stocks shall be selected from the universe of stocks ranked within top 1000, top 1100, top 1200 and so on, based on both average daily turnover and average daily full market capitalization based on previous six months period data, until at least 10 eligible stocks are obtained, subject to fulfilment of other inclusion criteria. If the number of eligible stocks is still less than 10, then the index may have less than 10 constituents.
- Companies should form part of respective sector universe.
- A preference shall be given to companies that are available for trading in NSE's Futures & Options segment at the time of final selection.
- The companies are sorted in the descending order of the average free-float market capitalization (FF market capitalization) and final selection of companies shall be made based on the FF market capitalization to form part of the index.
- Companies will be included if free-float market capitalisation is at least 1.5 times the free float market capitalization of the smallest index constituent in respective index.

Index reconstitution and rebalancing

All Nifty indices are reconstituted at pre-defined periodicity as tabulated hereunder. Unless mentioned otherwise in the methodology document, the additional index reconstitution may be undertaken:

- in case any of the index constituent undergoes merger, demerger, delisting, specific cases of capital restructuring etc.
- in case any of the index constituent is moved to BZ/ SZ series.
- if trading permission of any of the index constituent is withdrawn from F&O segment (in case of indices where it is mandatory that all the constituents of an index must be available for trading in F&O)
- if a security is suspended for trading from Capital Market or SME Emerge at NSE for any reason.
- in case of any adverse regulatory findings or orders issued against any of the index constituent that necessitates removal of such stock from the index.

In case of merger/ amalgamation, transferor company (a company which is being merged into another company) shall be excluded from index on the ex-date (T Day) of merger i.e. closing of T-1 day as mentioned below:

- Indices with fixed number of constituents: On ex-date, a replacement of company will be made based on the eligibility criteria of respective indices in place of transferor company which is being excluded.
- Indices with variable number of constituents: On ex-date, no replacement will be made in place of the transferor company which is being excluded.
- Announcement of the changes shall be made providing notice of minimum three working days including the indices on which Futures and Options are traded at NSE.
- Equity shares, investible weight factor of merged entity (combined entity post-merger) shall be updated based on the terms of merger on the ex-date of merger i.e. closing of T1 day In case of capital restructuring or voluntary delisting, equity shareholders' approval is considered as a trigger to initiate the replacement of such stock from the index through additional index reconstitution. For all other cases, replacements will be initiated based on notifications issued by the Exchange.

Further, on a quarterly basis, index will be screened for compliance with the portfolio concentration norms for equity ETFs/ Index Funds announced by SEBI on January 10, 2019. In case of non-compliance of any of the stated norms, suitable corrective measures such as replacement of ineligible stock, re-alignment of constituent weights will be undertaken depending upon the nature of non-compliance to ensure the compliance of norms. Replacement of stocks resulting from periodic index reconstitution will be implemented from the last trading day (beginning of day) of March, June, September and December depending upon the review frequency as may be applicable for each index. In case of scheduled reconstitution of broad market indices, a four weeks' prior notice is given to the market participants. For reconstitution of other indices (whether scheduled or additional), prior notice of minimum 5 working days is given to the relevant market participants in a suitable manner. Index Maintenance Sub-Committee (Equity) in exceptional situation may announce reconstitution of any index with a notice of less than 5 working days.

Index rebalancing:

In case of capped indices, capping of stocks will be implemented from the last trading day of March, June, September and December by taking into account closing prices as on T-3 basis, where T Day is last trading day of March, June, September and December. Quarterly rebalancing of shares and investible weight factors will be implemented from the last trading day of March, June, September and December.
